

New He 'Aina Ola Farm Dinner Launches on Kaua'i

KAUA'I, HI, May 6, 2016 – [The Westin Princeville Ocean Resort Villas](#) announces a partnership with the Waipā Foundation to launch He 'Aina Ola, a twice-monthly dinner tour starting Monday, May 9, 2016. This unique dining experience will highlight Hawaiian history, culture and the island's bounty through a walking tour and three-course dinner with wine pairings at the Waipā Foundation on the island's north shore. The cost of \$135 per person includes the walking tour, three-course dinner with wine pairings, tax and gratuity.

He 'Aina Ola, which translates to "A Nourishing Feast," begins with a tour of Waipā's orchard and gardens, located just past the town of Hanalei. The foundation's knowledgeable staff will share the history of the area and the organization's efforts to practice cultural stewardship in the ancient ahupua'a, a historical land division defined by the boundaries of the watershed from mauka to makai (mountains to sea).

Following the tour, a three-course dinner with wine pairings will be offered in Waipā's Laukupu Hale Imu. Prepared by The Westin Princeville culinary team, the dinner will showcase seasonal, locally sourced ingredients, including produce grown at Waipā. The inaugural event will feature a lemongrass consommé with poached Kaua'i shrimp, and freshly caught opakapaka (pink snapper) with chard, onions and a Hawaiian chili lemongrass butter sauce, presented in a pū'olo (parcel) made from ti leaves. Taro malasadas with mint frosting, cilantro, lime icing and a citrus crème anglaise is a sweet ending to a memorable meal.
